Kia ora koutou,

Next week is week 7 and then we begin the last 4 weeks of this term. It has been a very good week here at Kelburn and the disco last night showed off our school in good heart.

Our Student Council led the planning for the disco and it was an excellent event. The DJ and the children combined to have the right songs that saw a lot of dancing and a really great spirit. Lots of songs from the 'older' era even saw some hip wiggling from the old people in the room - the staff! The disco raised funds for the Tamariki Education Centre in Nairobi, Kenya which is a small school built by Kiwis for children who would not normally go to school. Last night's disco will help enable them to have something as simple as electricity or water at the school. This activity was the beginning of our partnership with this school.



We loved our youngest children in Tupu leading the assembly today. They did a fantastic job.

At assembly this morning I talked to the children about empathy. For us empathy is about the ability to understand and share the feelings of another. It is different to sympathy.

Empathy is important for our manaakitanga, we have to get on with each other every day and by developing our skills to understand others, as well as ourselves, we can develop the skills to respond appropriately to the situation. We know that empathetic behaviour leads to a kinder, more helping type of behaviour and being aware and inclusive of others is crucial for success on our school community. It is important for our children to develop strong traits of empathy, because one day they will be involved in and leading our community.

This morning the PTA arranged a coffee cart for the parents for an informal gathering before we had assembly. It was nice to see this was well attended and thank you to Ripe Coffee for their generosity. Again an example of a kind community and being inclusive to all.

We farewell our 8 trainee teachers today as they finish up their 6 week posting at Kelburn. Thank you to Rose, Ushani, Julie, Ben, Julie, Joanna, Maoko, Emily who have really made the most of their time at our school and look like they will be a credit to the teaching force from next year and beyond. We always like to see our trainees get stuck in when they get here and this group really has rolled up their sleeves and worked very hard with out tamariki. The children will be sad to see them go. Having said that, we welcome Greta who joins Richard's Dobson's group for the next 3 weeks.
