Some housekeeping

Sweets before school - a small number of children are heading to the shops on their way to school and purchasing sweets and eating them/sharing with others before school. Some children just bring sweets to school from home.

While I don't want to affect someone's business, this action impacts on children's capacity to learn and/or impacts on their ability to display good learning behaviour with others.

Cell phones - a reminder that our policy for cellphones is for children to hand them into the office or the class teacher on arrival to school each day.

Pokemon cards - the trading and/or swapping of Pokemon (or cards in general) consistently causes huge problems between children. Teachers have requested that these DO NOT come to school. Any Pokemon cards at school will come to me and then can be collected by the child at the end of the day.

Absenteeism - children need to be at school. We have a 92% attendance per annum rate at Kelburn across the year, which while appears very good, equates to an average of about 24 children per day away (2 children per room). Please be consistent with your children about attending school and absenteeism should only be really for illness or an appointment. Teachers plan a sequential programme and so when children miss school the learning sequence is broken. Frequent absences or being away from school through choice can often lead to problems later on.

Performing Arts - It's great to see so many children coming along to these activities and participating so enthusiastically. Please also consider the benefits of your child learning a musical instrument, including drumming with Tom Scrase. At KNS your child can learn these instruments; clarinet, flute, recorder, piano, guitar, banjo, ukelele, violin, cello, singing, chamber music and drums/percussion. Details from the school office.

The Kelburn Netball Club is affiliated to the Wellington West Netball competition. Games are held on Saturday mornings at either Marsden school or at the Victoria University Campus courts in Karori for all of term 2 and the first 5-6 weeks of term 3 for teams from years 5 to 8. There is an additional Future Ferns tournament for players in years 1 to 4.

The club is currently run by a group of 7-8 parents and the teams are coached and managed by parents and friends of the club. We are always looking for people to help out with small jobs, fundraising or even providing sponsorship for new equipment.

For those in years 5 to 8:

Registrations close Monday 27th Feb. Subs will remain at \$80 this season.

This year we are running trials for years 7 and 8 only. Those in years 5 and 6 will not be required to trial but will be placed in year group teams of equal ability.

Year 7 and 8:

Trials dates and times for years 7 and 8 are: Sunday 5th March from 12-2pm and Sunday 12 March 12-2pm at the Karori Rec Centre. Children will be required to come to both sessions.

As part of your registration, if in year 7 or 8, your child will need to state whether they would prefer to be in a competitive or social team and choose 3 positions they would like to play. These positions will be used to put together teams for the trials so the selector can see the children playing in different combinations. They will also give coaches an idea of your child's preference. Remember that a team needs all 7 positions and the team make up will be decided by the coaches in consultation with their players.
