Covid

With the beautiful weather and winter far from our minds, it is easy to forget that COVID-19 is still around and quickly spreads in groups. We are mindful of the latest research that highlights the effect this virus can have on people's brain health, particularly our tamariki cognition, as their brains are still developing.

At kura, we keep our learning spaces well-ventilated and utilise the outdoor spaces when possible. We would appreciate you supporting us and keeping your children at home if they have COVID-19 to reduce the risk of spreading this virus to others.

Maths No Problem!

Our new mathematics resource has arrived! Kaiako have started using these resources with tamariki, and they are all getting used to this new system and new routines. As with all change, there will be a time for everyone to adjust to using these new routines, workbooks, textbooks and learning processes. Our previous mathematics programme had many strengths, and we saw positive results from our tamariki. Still, after a review of it last year, we recognised how we could strengthen and streamline it further across the kura by embracing this new approach.

You may wonder how we choose our resources from the four different ones the Ministry presented. Our teachers went through a rigorous process of comparing and evaluating each one last term, and they decided on the Maths No Problem resource as it aligned with our current research on how tamariki learn. It encourages tamariki to discuss their ideas and explain their thinking in pairs and as a whole class, it has open problem-solving opportunities, focuses on a growth mindset, and is grounded in good theory and research. You will see changes in this approach, such as how tamariki will now be taught in year groups.

It was busy here at kura during the break; we are pleased to share some exciting updates about our school grounds! **Gully** - repairs have been completed on the tyre climb, clatter bridge, incline net and deck landings in the Gully Adventure playground, ensuring a safer and more enjoyable space for our tamariki. In the next holiday period, repairs to the flying fox and scale wall will be completed. A huge thank you to our talented PTA for their generous support in funding these repairs.
