Staffing

Tamariki and staff miss him, and everyone is pitching in to help, including Nicholas, a uni student whom we have employed for a couple of hours a day to help around the grounds. I know Matau is missing us all, so if you would like to wish him well or drop a card off at the office, please do; this will help to keep him in good spirits.

Playing games well

At our kura, participating in sports and physical activities offers more than just physical benefits; it also provides a valuable opportunity for tamariki to practise the Key Competencies, particularly their resilience being a good sport. Being a good sport encompasses playing fair and by the rules; showing respect to teammates and the opposing team; respecting the decisions of the referee or the group decision; and handling both victories and defeats with grace. These are tricky skills that kaiako teach directly through inthe-moment discussions during P.E and games; in small group problem-solving discussions, particularly after break times; through lessons using drama and role play, and picture books.

As a kura, we are focusing on these skills for the term so tamariki can use them in their unstructured play before school, and at break times. Please help to reinforce these at home by talking to your child about how they may respond in different situations and how they can encourage others by:

- Playing by the rules.
- Be honest.
- Wait for your turn.
- Comment on the other players' good moves.
- Allowing other players to have a reasonable amount of time to have their turn.
- Say positive things to the other players.
- If you have bad luck or get out, accept it and move on.

After School Pick-up

The safety of tamariki is important, and we would like to remind you that school finishes at 3:00pm, and children should be collected promptly. Staff are not available to supervise students after this time, and leaving them unattended in the playground or on school grounds can pose safety risks.

If you are unable to pick up your child on time, please arrange alternative care to ensure their well-being or enrol them in Kelly Club. If you are running late, please contact the school office as soon as possible so we can let your child know. Thank you for your support in keeping all our tamariki safe.


Library Appeal

Parking - Kowhai Road Quick Stop Zone

Please do not park in front of the garages on Boundary Road. We have received complaints from neighbours who regularly have their vehicles blocked in by parents who have parked in front of their garages.

Security Cameras

Please be aware that security cameras are operating on school grounds to deter and investigate any vandalism to school property and other antisocial or illegal activity. The cameras are not operating inside school buildings and are programmed to only record activity outside of school hours.
